<b>Attend</b> Attend a church meeting (ask your pastor about what might be possible in your congregation such as council or other teams/committees).. Afterwards, either write 7 or more sentences or record a 2 minute video sharing at least 3 things that you learned and how that connects with your life.	<b>Reflection</b> Look at your school handbook or a set of classroom rules from one of your teachers. Reflect in 7 or more sentences on what purpose this document has, what you appreciate about it, and what you might change.	<b>Write/Create</b> Write a letter (7 sentences or more) to Moses. Ask him whatever you'd like to know about when he received the Ten Commandments.
<b>Interview</b> Interview a congregation member (not in your family) who attends church regularly. Ask them things like: What is their faith background & story? How did they end up being part of our congregation & why? Why are they Lutheran? What is important to them about our church? What ways could our church be more faithful to God? In regards to faith, what do they hope to pass along to the next generation? If they're not Lutheran, how does their church connect with their beliefs? Write down their answers and summarize their responses.	<b>Memorize</b> Memorize one of the explanations of the 10 Commandments. and recite it for an adult in your household.  Reflect in 3 or more sentences on why our ancestors may have had to memorize all 10 explanations.	<b>Write/Create</b> Write new lyrics to a familiar song/rap to help you memorize the 10 commandments. Then take a video of yourself singing the song.
<b>Read</b> Read a whole book of the Pentateuch (first 5 books). Write 1-2 paragraphs of a response of what happened, what you learned, and/or what most surprised you.	<b>Create</b> In whatever creative from you'd like (collage, draw, sculpt, music, etc.), create something that might represent one of the Ten Commandments. Submit a picture of what you create with a 1-2 sentence explanation.	<b>Explore</b> Look around your congregation's or another congregation's building (sanctuary, meeting rooms, etc.) to see if you can find any evidence of the Ten Commandments. Write 2-3 sentences about where you looked and what you found or didn't find.
